Liliana Dávila Stern

A conservationist promoting more sustainable business practices

I work for The Nature Conservancy, where I am the Director for Mexico and Northern Central America. I am engaged in finding ways to preserve landscapes with high ecological values, which are currently under threat due to inappropriate business practices in agriculture and forestry. As a campaigner and activist, I work directly with corporations, but also with a range of other actors, including policy-makers, non-profits, universities and local communities. I believe that better data and improved transparency are key to better business practices with less environmental impact. I am therefore now working on a tool that can help various actors get easy access to reliable land-use data.

I credit growing up in Portland in the Pacific NW for three traits that have been formative in my life: a deep love for the environment, a curiosity to explore and ask questions, and not being deterred by tough weather (both physically and metaphorically). I merge my passion for asking tough questions and working for environmental sustainability into my PhD focus: Plastic waste management in the Global South. I am currently focusing on the case study of the interlinking social factors that contribute to plastic waste/pollution in Colombo Sri Lanka, one of the hotspots for plastic waste in South Asia.

I began asking questions about plastic waste and (un)sustainable development trajectories as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Mali, West Africa (2005-07; and also a PC Response Volunteer in Guinea 2010-11). What does long-term sustainability mean for a community? How can we change the development discourse to favor social and environmental balance? How can communities in far corners of the globe maintain their culture and environment in the face of development pressures? These questions led me to work and volunteer over the past 15 years in such places as Nepal, Bhutan, Trinidad & Tobago, Vietnam, Honduras, Mexico, India, Hawaii (permaculture), and Japan.

I became the co-chair for the Education for Sustainable Living Program (ESLP), a radical educational experiment that collaborated with world-class sustainability leaders such as Vandana Shiva, Satish Kumar, and Frances Moore Lappe. ESLP facilitated institutional change through student empowerment and participatory action research. I founded Tokyo Urban Permaculture as an experiment to fundamentally transform the culture and politics of Tokyo, after the Fukushima nuclear meltdown in 2011 and now teach permaculture, nonviolent communication, mindfulness, systems thinking, social change and about the gift economy (gift ecology) around the world.
